Virginia

Richard Lee Bly

Corporal Bly was born 10/01/1927 and was from Strasburg, Shenandoah County, Virginia. His parents were Cecil Warner and Bernice Nitterhouse Bly. He was a veteran of World War II. In Korea, he was a member of the Army's Company G, 2nd Battalion, 5th Cavalry Regiment. He was seriously wounded when his jeep ran over an enemy land mine near Mason-Dong, North Korea on 11/16/1950 and he died of those wounds on the 22nd. He is buried at Arlington National Cemetery (Sec: 34; Site: 505-A).



Philip F. Braithwaite

Private Braithwaite of Frederick County, Virginia, was born 08/04/1930, the son of Fred W. and Cora R. Carpenter Braithwaite. He was a member of the 9th Infantry Regiment, G Company, 2nd Battalion, 2nd Infantry Division. On 03/04/1951, he was killed in action in Operation Killer while fighting the enemy in South Korea. He was buried in Woodlawn Cemetery, Whitacre in Frederick County, Virginia.



Garland Ray Carroll

Private First Class Carroll was from Frederick County and was born 06/23/1930. He served as a medic with the Army's Medical Company, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. He was listed as missing in action while tending his wounded comrades in North Korea on 11/05/1951. He was presumed dead on 12/31/1953. His remains were not recovered. He is memorialized on the Honolulu Memorial.



Charles Murphy Clem

Private First Class Clem, from Frederick County, was born in Shenandoah County on 03/18/1928 to Frederick C. and Blanch M. Clem. He served with the Army's 17th Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division. On 05/27/1951, while fighting the enemy, he was killed in action. He is buried in Riverview Cemetery, Strasburg, Virginia.



Algernon S. Clowe

Sergeant Clowe was born in 1929 in Warren County, Virginia. He was the son of Henry J. and Bessie C. Clowe of Marshall, Virginia. He enlisted in the U.S. Army in July 1947. He served with the 8th Division, 24th Infantry, and was stationed in Japan in 1949. Sgt. Clowe's unit was among the first sent to fight the invading Korean Army, arriving in Korea on 07/04/1950. Sgt. Clowe was killed in action on 03/08/1951.



Edward L. Collier

Corporal Collier, Frederick County, was born 05/12/1932, the son of Robert L. and Laura E. Collier. He was a member of the 5th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. He was killed in action 08/20/1950 while fighting the enemy in the Taegu area of South Korea. He was buried in the Winchester National Cemetery (Sec: 92; Site: 4136-C) on 07/25/1951.



William Reese Coverstone

Sergeant First Class Coverstone, son of William Madison and Nora Funk Coverstone, Warren County, Virginia was born 03/08/1930. He was a member of Company E, 2nd Battalion, 5th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. He was seriously injured in South Korea on 09/08/1950, recovered, and returned to duty on 10/04/1950. He was listed as missing in action while fighting the enemy in the Chongchon River area of North Korea on 11/28/1950. He was presumed dead on 12/31/1953. His remains were not recovered.



Edward N. Davenport*

Marine Corps Corporal Davenport of Warren County, Virginia, was born 06/14/1931. He was the son of Lillian Davenport and was raised in the home of his grandparents, Henry and Hattie Conway, where he lived with his mother. Corporal Davenport died in service of drowning in Sasebo Harbor, Sasebo, Japan on 05/28/1953. He is buried in Good Hope Cemetery, Warren County.

George Washington Dodson*

Army Sergeant Dodson, son of Ellis Clifton and Nellie Florence Atkins Dodson, was born 03/09/1928. His home of record is Warren County, Virginia. He was a member of Company A, 1st Battalion, 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. He contracted dysentery at Wonju, South Korea, was taken to the 11th Evacuation Hospital and died of illness on 05/21/1951. He is listed as being buried at Masonic Cemetery, Washington, Rappahannock County, Virginia.

Boyd "Bodie" Francis Grim

Army Private Grim, the son of Charles H. and Ola C. Boyd Grim, was born 08/18/1928 in Frederick County and lived on West Germain Street, Winchester in 1940. He graduated from Handley High School in the Class of 1946. He was a member of the 7th Infantry Regiment, G Company, 2nd battalion and was killed in action on 04/24/1951, while fighting the enemy in Uijongu-tong duchan, South Korea. "Bodie Grim Field" at Jim Barnett Park, across from the Korean War Memorial, is named after him. He is buried at Mount Hebron Cemetery, Winchester, Virginia in Section A next to his parents.



Charles Nelson Hall*

Airman 2nd Class Hall, 61st Troop Carrier Group, was born 12/19/1929. He was the son of Chowning R. and Henrietta Nelson Hall of Front Royal, Virginia. He was a passenger on a C-124A Globemaster that was carrying 105 passengers and 10 crew members from Larsen Air Field, Moses Lake, Washington. The Air Force had a program called "Operation Sleigh Ride," which brought servicemen and veterans home in time for the holidays. "Lucky" passengers were chosen by lottery. "The accident took place at 6:27 am on 12/20/1952. The plane took off, climbed to about 100 feet, started to turn then plunged back to earth. The plane shattered into pieces of metal in a fiery crash." He is buried at Prospect Hill Cemetery, Front Royal, Virginia.



Robert Lee Henry

Private First Class Henry, the son of Luther F. Henry of Warren County, Virginia, was born 01/10/1929. He was a member of the 35th Infantry Regiment, 25th Infantry Division. On 09/01/1950, he was killed in action while fighting the enemy in the Nam River-Kuhe-Ri Area in the Pusan Perimeter in South Korea. He is buried at Prospect Hill Cemetery, Front Royal, Virginia.

William Franklin Henry

Corporal Henry, born 09/21/1927, was the son of Harry William and Vallie Virginia Tharpe Henry. He was a member of the 27th Infantry Regiment, 25th Infantry Division. He was seriously wounded by the enemy in South Korea on 07/27/1950, recovered, and returned to duty on 10/31/1950. He was killed in action near Kuryong River-Ipsok, Changchon River area of North Korea on 11/29/1950. He is buried in Prospect Hill Cemetery, Front Royal, Virginia.



Charles William Hockman

Master Sergeant Hockman, of Shenandoah County, was the son of Jesse Franklin and Freda A. Seal Hockman. He was born 03/07/1928 and served with the 187th Infantry Airborne Regimental Combat Team, HQ Company, 1st Battalion. He was killed in action on 07/17/1953 while fighting the enemy in North Korea. He is buried at Maurertown Brethern Church Cemetery, Maurertown, Virginia.



Joseph Anthony Jagiello

Staff Sergeant Jagiello, of Winchester, served with the US Marine Corps, A Company, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines. He was born 08/26/1924 at Quantico, Virginia. His parents were Anthony Joseph and Stephany Sziagowska Jagiello. He was killed in action on 11/04/1950 during an assault by his platoon against Hill 532, south of Sudong. His **Silver Star** citation says "Staff Sergeant Jagiello [Jagiello] fearlessly moved among his men under heavy enemy fire, shouting words of encouragement and directing effective fire against the fanatic attackers. Personally engaging the hostile troops in hand-to-hand combat when they penetrated his lines, he boldly led his men in breaking through encirclement and in withdrawing to tenable ground before he was mortally wounded by a bursting enemy grenade. His inspiring leadership, valiant fighting spirit and courageous devotion to duty in the face of extremely heavy odds reflect the highest credit upon Staff Sergeant Jagiello [Jagiello] and the United States Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country." He is buried at Arlington National Cemetery (Sec: 31; Site 5389).



Kenneth Lee Lam

Private First Class Lam was born 08/01/1931. He was the son of Louie Alexander and Pauline O. Orndorff Lam and grew up in Shenandoah County, Virginia. He served with the 29th Infantry Regiment, B Company, 1st Battalion, 24th Infantry Division. He was killed in action fighting the enemy near Anui in the Pusan Perimeter in South Korea. He is buried in Riverview Cemetery, Strasburg, Virginia.



Douglas Hinkle William Lamp

Private First Class Lamp was born in 1929 and grew up in Winchester, Frederick County, Virginia. According to the 1930 Federal Census, he was the son of Hinkle M. and Ollie M. Lamp. He served with the 180th Infantry Regiment, 45th Infantry Division. He was killed in action while fighting the enemy at Hill 200 in the Chorwon Area of North Korea on 06/16/1952. He is buried at Mount Hebron Cemetery, Winchester, Virginia.



Allen Kenneth Legge

Captain Legge, of Winchester, Frederick County, Virginia was born 05/08/1924. The 1940 Federal Census lists his parents as Clark Edward and Irene Hawkins Legge. He graduated from Handley high School in 1943 and was a member of the 31st Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division. He was killed in action while fighting the enemy in South Korea on 01/14/1951. He is buried at the Winchester National Cemetery (Sec: 90; Site 4384).



William J. Levi

First Lieutenant Levi, from Berryville, Clarke County, Virginia, was born 08/14/1923. He was the son of Charles Thomas and Marion Dearing Williams Levi. He was the pilot of an F-51D Mustang night fighter with the 40th Fighter Interceptor Squadron, 35th Fighter Interceptor Group, 6150th Tactical Support Wing. On 09/07/1950, while on a combat mission in South Korea, his aircraft received a direct hit by anti-aircraft fire, crashed and burst into flames. He is buried in Green Hill Cemetery in Berryville.



James Edward McKenzie

Private McKenzie, of Shenandoah County, Virginia was born 06/04/1932. He was the son of George Melvin and Florence E. Leath McKenzie. He was a member of the Army's 23rd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. He was killed in action while fighting the enemy in the Changnyong area of South Korea on 09/07/1950. He is buried in the Mount Jackson Cemetery, Mount Jackson, Virginia.



Lewis D. "Buddy" Mowery

Corporal Mowery, from Warren County, Virginia was born 05/26/1931. He was the son of Katherine Mowery. He was a member of the 55th Field Artillery Battalion, 5th Infantry Regimental Combat Team. He was killed in action while fighting the enemy at CS508932 in the Ukkolgye-Death Valley area of South Korea on 04/25/1951. He is buried in the Riverview Cemetery, Strasburg, Virginia.



Willard E. "Will" Nickens

Private First Class Nickens was born 10/23/1929, the son of George C. and Susie L. Nickens of Strasburg, Shenandoah County, Virginia. He was killed in action while fighting the enemy in North Korea on 02/14/1953. He is buried in Mount Zion Cemetery, Strasburg, Virginia.



Thomas Clayton Pierce, Jr.

Private First Class Pierce was the son of Thomas Clayton Pierce, Sr. and Anna Virginia Pierce of Clarke County, Virginia. He was born 05/13/1913 in Millwood. He was a member of the Army's Medical Corps of the 5th Infantry Division. He was survived by his parents, five sisters and three brothers, including PFC Albert Pierce, who served in Korea with the US Army's 40th Infantry Division. He is buried in Green Hill Cemetery, Berryville, Virginia.



Claude Edward “Moose” Reedy

Sergeant Reedy, from Shenandoah County, Virginia, was born 06/10/1932. The 1940 Federal Census lists Claude B. Reedy as his father. He was a medic with the 9th Infantry Regiment, MED CO, 2nd Infantry Division. He was taken prisoner of war while tending his wounded comrades in the Kunu-Ri Gauntlet in the Chongchon River area of North Korea on 12/01/1950. He was presumed dead on 01/19/1951. His remains are listed as “not recovered.” There is a marker at St. Matthews Cemetery in New Market, Virginia.



Beverley Eugene Russell

Corporal Russell, from Frederick County, Virginia was born on 08/23/1931. The 1940 census finds him living in the home of his paternal aunt and her husband, William F and Ella Russell Grubb, in the Longmarsh District of Clark County. He was a member of the Army's 31st Infantry Regiment, M Company, 3rd Battalion, 7th Infantry Division. He was listed as missing in action while fighting the enemy on the Eastern Shore of the Chosin Reservoir on 12/02/1950. On 12/12/1950 his status was changed to presumed dead. His remains were not recovered. He is listed on the Honolulu Memorial.



Robert Francis “Bobby” Shambaugh

Corporal Shambaugh was born 04/20/1929, the son of Arthur J. and Nellie Frances McDonald Shambaugh. He grew up in the Stonewall area of Frederick County, Virginia. He was a member of Company B, 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division. He was killed in action when his squad was cut off from his platoon during the drive for Seoul, South Korea on 09/22/1950. The Winchester Star listed him as the first Winchester soldier to be killed in Korea. He is buried in Mount Hebron Cemetery, Winchester.



Harold A. Sutphin

Private First Class Sutphin, of Shenandoah County, Virginia, was born 02/14/1930, the son of Lawrence M. and Rose Lorraine Knupp Sutphin. He was a member of the 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. He was killed in action on 11/09/1950, while fighting the enemy, with an infantry unit in Sinpyoung, North Korea. He left a wife, whom he married on 09/04/1950. He was buried at Arlington Cemetery 05/26/1955 (Sec: 34; Site 708).



Frank Beckwith “Taffy” Tucker

Captain Tucker was born 08/16/1924 in Welch, WV, the son of John and Eloise Beckwith Tucker. He attended public schools then went to Sewanee Military Academy in Tennessee, the University of Virginia, and the United States Military Academy at West Point, where he graduated in 1946. He spent nearly two years as a member of the Army of the Occupation. On 10/21/1950 he married Cary Randolph Marshall in Winchester, Virginia. On Christmas Day he left for the Pacific Coast and was later ordered into active duty in Korea, where he commanded Company A, 15th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Division. He received a battle wound on 03/21/1951 and was awarded a Bronze Star for bravery in action. He was later returned to active duty. On 09/29/1951 he was leading an attack on Hill 487 near Ukkonggi, North Korea, when he was mortally wounded. For his gallantry that day he was posthumously awarded the **Silver Star**. On 01/03/1952 he was buried in Zion Episcopal Church Cemetery, Charles Town, WV.



Hugh Douglas Whitacre

Master Sergeant Whitacre was born 07/27/1923, the son of Holliday Douglas and Gettie Virginia Anderson Whitacre and grew up in the Back Creek and Gore areas of Frederick County, Virginia. He was a member of Company C, 2nd Chemical Mortar Battalion. He was seriously wounded by the enemy near Kunari, North Korea on 11/26/1950 and later returned to duty. That same day he was captured by the enemy. He is listed as died while missing. For his leadership and valor, he received the **Silver Star**. His remains were not recovered. He has a marker at Ebenezer Christian Church Cemetery in Gore, Virginia. He left a wife, Edna Becker Whitacre, and a daughter. His niece reports that either she or his daughter attends a yearly meeting of the committee that reports on identification of remains, hoping that he will be located and returned to the family.



West Virginia

Lester William Abshire

Corporal Abshire, Hedgesville, Berkeley County, West Virginia was born 01/06/1931. He was the son of Lester W. and Helen Stokes Abshire. He was a member of the 19th Infantry Regiment, E Company, 2nd Battalion, 24th Infantry Division. On 08/09/1950, he was killed in action while fighting the enemy in the Naktong Bulge area of South Korea. A veteran marker was ordered for a cemetery in Hedgesville, West Virginia, but a specific grave site in Hedgesville could not be found.

Charles Robert “Bobby” Albright

Private First Class Albright, Morgan County, West Virginia, was born 01/04/1929, the son of James A. and Pearl M. Albright. He was a member of the 38th Field Artillery Battalion (105 MM), C Battery, 2nd Infantry Division. On 11/29/1950 he was killed in action while fighting the enemy in the Kumu-Ri area of the Chongchon River, North Korea. His remains were returned later and interred in 1956. He is buried in Camp Hill Cemetery, Paw Paw, West Virginia.



Charles Robert Athey

Corporal Athey, Morgan County, West Virginia, was born 11/21/1929. He was a member of the 23rd Infantry Regiment, C Company, 1st Battalion, 2nd Infantry Division. He was the son of Charles Thomas and Hazel Pearl Amick Athey. On 10/01/1952 he was killed in action while fighting the enemy in the Chorwon area of North Korea. His remains were not recovered. He is listed on the Honolulu Memorial.



John Cabell Breckinridge

First Lieutenant Breckinridge of Summit Point, Jefferson County, West Virginia was born 11/19/1925, the son of General James C. and Dorothy Tomson Breckinridge. He was a member of the 1st Marine Regiment, B Company, 1st Battalion, 1st Marine Division. On 10/09/1951 he was killed in action while fighting the enemy in the Punchbowl, North Korea. He was buried in Lexington Cemetery, Lexington, Kentucky. He was awarded a **Silver Star** for valor. He was the great-grandson of John C. Breckinridge, Vice President of the United States.



Stanley Edwin Bullock

First Lieutenant Bullock, Jefferson County, West Virginia was born 12/28/1922, the son of Frank Joseph and Laura May Finlay Bullock. He was a member of the 65th Infantry Regiment, B Company, 1st Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division. On 01/28/1952 he was listed as missing in action and was presumed dead. His remains were not recovered or identified. He was survived by a spouse, Sidney Strider Bullock.



Paul V. Carder

Army Sergeant First Class Carder, from Hampshire County, West Virginia, was born in 1924. He was the son of Robert L. and Mary E. Carder and a member of the 578th Engineer Combat Battalion, 40th Infantry Division where he worked as a Combat Construction foreman. On 06/12/1953 he received a missile wound while fighting the enemy in North Korea. He died of his wounds the following day, 06/13/1953. He is buried at Oldtown Veterans Cemetery, Oldtown, Alleghany, Maryland.



Willard Samuel Cave

Private Cave, Berkeley County, West Virginia, was born on 11/16/1929, the son of James E. and Aretta McDugal Cave. He was a member of the 21st Infantry Regiment, G Company, 2nd Battalion, 24th Infantry Division. He was wounded in a missile strike while fighting the enemy in North Korea on 12/07/1950 and died from those wounds on 12/08/1950. He is buried in Rosedale Cemetery, Martinsburg, West Virginia.



Warren M. "Ward" Clark

Private E2 Clark of Berkeley County, West Virginia, was born 07/25/1925. He was a member of the 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. He was killed in action on 01/07/1951 while fighting the enemy in South Korea. He was awarded the **Silver Star** posthumously "for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in connection with military operations against the enemy." He is buried at Central Chapel Cemetery in Hedgesville, West Virginia.



John Bruce Crouse

Private First Class Crouse, Morgan County, West Virginia, was born 04/12/1932, the son of Roy Hammond and Mildred Lee Brannon Crouse. He was a member of the 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. He was killed in action on 10/09/1951 while fighting the enemy in the Chorwon Area, North Korea. He is buried at Salem Cemetery, Morgan County, West Virginia.



Wellington Davenport

Sergeant Davenport, of Jefferson County, West Virginia was born 08/25/1914, the son of James and Patsy S. Davenport. He was a member of the 15th Infantry Regiment, L Company, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division. He was killed in action on 01/27/1951 while fighting the enemy in North Korea. He is buried in Myerstown Cemetery, Rippon, Jefferson County, West Virginia.



Samuel Davis

Sergeant Davis of Jefferson County, West Virginia was born 02/15/1930, the son of Alvia Jeff and Hattie West Davis. He was a member of the 180th Infantry Regiment, 45th Infantry Division. He was killed in action on 02/24/1953 while fighting the enemy in Korea. He was buried in Winchester National Cemetery (Sec: 89; Site: 4358) on 04/25/1953.



Carl William Edwards

Private Edwards of Berkeley County, West Virginia, was born on 06/25/1931, the son of Elmer E. and Bertha Ellen Smith Edwards. He was a member of the 29th Infantry Regiment, 1st Battalion, 24th Infantry Division. On 08/01/1950, while fighting the enemy at the Notch Area, Chinju, in the Pusan Perimeter-Southwest, he was killed in action. He is buried at Salem United Methodist Cemetery, Martinsburg, West Virginia.



Junior F. Frock

First Lieutenant Frock, of Morgan County, West Virginia, was born 09/27/1927, the son of Frederick V. and Margie E. Frock. He was a member of the 9th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. On 03/17/1953, while fighting the enemy at Little Gibril Ter-Kowang-San (Hill 355), Imjin River-Double Horseshoe in North Korea, he was injured and died of wounds later that day. He is buried at Bergstrasse Cemetery, Lancaster County, Ephrata, Pennsylvania.



Ernest Elsworth Getts

Private Getts of Berkeley County, West Virginia, was born 01/02/1930, the son of Elsworth J. and Isabelle Poole Getts. He was a member of the 27th Infantry Regiment, 25th Infantry Division. He was seriously wounded 10/09/1950, recovered and returned to duty 10/22. He was seriously wounded again on 02/08/1951 fighting the enemy in South Korea and died of wounds later that day. He was buried at Morgan Chapel Graveyard, Bunker Hill Cemetery, Bunker Hill, West Virginia.



Robert Marion Hensler

Private First Class Hensler of Berkeley County, West Virginia, was born 07/04/1930. He was the son of Howard Keith and Marguerite Leona Butts Hensler. He was a member of the 187th Airborne Regimental Combat Team. On 02/15/1951 he was wounded while fighting the enemy in Wonju, South Korea and he died of wounds on 02/23/1951. He is buried at Rosedale Cemetery in Martinsburg, West Virginia.



Roy Whitmore Hollenbaugh

Private First Class Hollenbaugh of Morgan County, West Virginia, was born 04/23/1932, the son of Samuel Albert and Anna J. Hollenbaugh. He was a member of the 23rd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. On 09/01/1950, he was killed in action while fighting the enemy in Changnyong, South Korea. He is buried in Prospect Hill Cemetery, Newville, Pennsylvania.



Hamilton Perry Horner

Corporal Horner of Berkeley County, West Virginia was born 02/09/1932. He was a member of 8th Cavalry Regiment, Headquarters Company, 3rd Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division. On 07/16/1950, he was killed in action while fighting the enemy at the Kum River in South Korea. He is buried at Mount Hope Cemetery, Peru, Miami County, Indiana.



Richard Marshall Ruppenthal

Ensign Ruppenthal of Inwood, Berkeley County, West Virginia was born 04/27/1928. He served as a pilot of an F4U-4 Corsair fighter with Fighter Squadron 192 aboard the carrier USS Princeton (CV-37).
